



FIGHTING FOOD INSECURITY

Did you know . . .

- More than 1.5 million Pennsylvanians including 443,000 children – don't know where their next meal is coming from.
- About 1/3 of college students report missing meals due to food insecurity.
- Nearly 35% of college students know someone who has dropped out due to food insecurity.

The Hunger-Free College Campuses Act empowers colleges and universities to tackle food insecurity head-on by:

- Providing up to \$1 million in grant funding.
- Establishing free campus food pantries.

 Launching innovative programs like allowing students to donate their unused meals or "swipes" from pre-purchased meal plans to those who face food insecurity

PROTECTING OUR PLANET

s minority chair of the Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committee, Senator Comitta is working to:

- Cut Emissions: Pennsylvania accounts for about 1% of global greenhouse gas emissions. Joining the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative will help cut carbon and air pollution by hundreds of millions of tons per year.
- Invest in Renewables: Pennsylvania should expand the electricity it requires from renewables, like wind and solar, to 30 percent by 2030.
- Senator Comitta secured key investments in open space and outdoor recreation, including \$175,000 for a new playground at Everhart Park in West Chester.

- Save Open Space: Nearly \$2 million in total funding to preserve 156 acres in East Bradford and 162 acres in Elk Township.
- Enact Stronger Pipeline Rules: Leading the most significant development on pipeline safety in recent history, as new pipeline rules advance through the Public Utility Commission. Comitta also convenes regular multi-stakeholder meetings on pipeline safety and communication with the Chester County Association of Township Officials.
- Transition to Clean Energy: Training workers for family-sustaining careers in the clean energy economy.
- Support Recycling: \$1 million for new equipment for the Southeastern Chester County Refuse Authority.
- Protect the Night Sky: Reducing light pollution saves energy while positively impacting human health, wildlife, and ecosystems, as well as traffic and pedestrian safety.
- Focus on Realistic Climate Goals: Aiming for Pennsylvania to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.

PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

s Mayor of West Chester, Senator Comitta brought together community and interfaith leaders to support tolerance, inclusivity, and peace. Today, she's bringing those same values to her work in the state legislature with a focus on health, safety, and community development.

- Strengthening Healthcare Infrastructure: \$2.1 million to expand inpatient and emergency department capacity at Chester County Hospital and \$50,000 for the physical therapy program at Community Volunteers in Medicine, which serves low-income families.
- Supporting Emergency First Responders: \$1.5 million for Berwyn Fire Company's new main firehouse and \$50,000 for upgraded equipment for Southern Chester County Emergency Medical Services/Medic 94.
- Safeguarding Religious
 Freedom: \$235,000 in total funding for security upgrades at five local nonprofit organizations that serve diverse communities, including two mosques and two synagogues.

- Protecting Our Neighbors in Need: \$50,000 for housing and shelter infrastructure repairs at the Domestic Violence Center of Chester County and new legislation to better protect people with disabilities from hate crimes.
- Investing in Community
 Development: \$1.35 million for the new Great Valley Community Center, \$2 million for a new theater in downtown Oxford, and \$2.4 million for the new Kennett Library.
- Stimulating Job Growth: \$370,000 for rail improvements that helped bring 150 new manufacturing jobs to the Atglen area.










former public school teacher, Senator Comitta has experienced firsthand the transformative power of education in improving the lives of students and families. On the Senate Education Committee, Comitta continues to work to:

- Invest in All Levels of Education: Students and schools need ongoing resources and support to recover from learning loss associated with the pandemic.
- Support After-School Programs: \$25,000 for a computer lab for the Coatesville Youth Initiative, \$25,000 for the Garage Community Youth Center in Kennett Square and Avondale, and \$50,000 for environmental education programs at the Brandywine YMCA.
- Enhance Student Mental Health and Wellness: Comitta's Senate Bill 791 aims to help increase access to school counselors, psychologists, social workers, and nurses.
- Assist Parents and Teachers: Forming a
 partnership with West Chester University to
 offer free stress reduction programs and
 techniques to parents and teachers.
